An ordinance to amend Section 1 of Ordinance No. 2812, as amended, and the map and map designations, which map and map designations, as amended, form a part of Ordinance No. 2812, as relates to and designates CI and U-8 use districts relative to said property.

WHEREAS, public notice and hearings have been given in connection with the changing of CI and U-8 use districts relative to the hereinafter described property as is established by Ordinance No. 2812, as passed by the Council of the Village of Euclid on the 13th day of December, 1922, which ordinance has from time to time been amended; and

WHEREAS, the amendment of said Ordinance No. 2812, which pertains to the hereinafter described property, by transferring said property from CI to U-8 use district, has been referred to the City Planning and Zoning Commission; and

WHEREAS, the City Planning and Zoning Commission has considered such amendment and proposed change at its regularly scheduled meeting on October 14, 2014, which will add to the present U-8 use district by inclusion of the property hereinafter described, and has recommended with conditions approval to Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Planning and Zoning Commission recommendation is conditioned upon the recording of a document establishing a shared parking agreement in conformance with the provisions of Euclid Codified Ordinance Section 1389.05 before a Certificate of Occupancy is issued for use of the area of this zoning map change; and

WHEREAS, in the interest of the general welfare of the City of Euclid and in order to promote the general advantage of public peace, safety, morals, convenience and prosperity of the inhabitants of the City of Euclid, this Council is of the opinion that the U-8 use district should be extended to include the property hereinafter described.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Euclid, State of Ohio:

Section 1: That the following property:

PP# 6445-21-01 & 011, 013, 037, 063

Situated in the City of Euclid, County of Cuyahoga and State of Ohio and known as being part of Original Euclid Township Tract No. 20 and the southerly part of Sublot Nos. 38 and 39 in Milan S. Kapel's Resubdivision of part of Carl L. Stein's East 262nd Street Subdivision of part of Original Euclid Township Tract No. 20 as recorded in Volume 150 of Maps, Page 40 of Cuyahoga County Records and bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at an iron pin set in the westerly line of east 262nd Street (50 feet wide) distance south 20.86 feet from the northeast corner of Sublot No. 38 as aforesaid;

Thence South along the Westerly line of East 262nd Street as aforesaid a distance of 79.16 feet to a point of curve between the said westerly line of East 262nd Street and the northerly line of Forestview Avenue (60 feet wide);

Thence southwesterly along said curve deflecting to the left an arc distance of 31.40 feet to a point of tangency in the northerly line of Forestview Avenue, said curved line having a radius of 20.01 feet and a chord which bears South 44°57'15" West 28.28 feet;

Thence South 89°54'30" West along the said northerly line of Forestview Avenue a distance of 114.77 feet to an iron pin set;

Thence North a distance of 102.33 feet to an iron pin set;

Thence South 88°44'09" East a distance of 134.78 feet to the place of beginning and containing an area of 0.3906 acres of land as surveyed and described by James R. Costabile Jr. P.S. Ohio No. 5868 September 17, 2014, be the same more or less, but subject to all legal highways.

Section 2: That so much of Section 1 of Ordinance No. 2812, as amended, as relates to the U-8 use district shall be extended to include the territory described in Section 1 hereinabove.

Section 3: That the map as adopted December 13, 1922 and as thereafter amended, is hereby amended to conform with the change of property described in Section 1 of the ordinance from CI to U-8 use district.

Section 4: That so much of Ordinance No. 2812, as amended, and the map and map designations as placed the above described property in CI use district, is hereby repealed.

Section 5: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 6: That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

An Emergency ordinance authorizing the Director of Finance to allocate and encumber funds for the payment of CH2M Hill, Inc. to provide scope of services that include a high level review of the city's existing CSO/SSO program, the development and evaluation of programmatic alternatives to the existing CSO/SSO program and recommendations for the how the City can apply the EPA's Integrated Planning Framework for wet weather programs and potentially modify the current Long Term Control Program.

WHEREAS, there is a significant storm water infiltration problem with Euclid's current Sanitary Sewer Collection system, causing the system to violate Federal Clean Water Standards; and

WHEREAS, where and how the infiltration is occurring is still not fully understood; and

WHEREAS, the Council for the City of Euclid on March 26, 2012 Resolution No 35-2012, called for an integrated and comprehensive review of green infrastructure solutions to control storm water infiltration in the sanitary sewer collection system; and

WHEREAS, the scope of work proposed will evaluate current program affordability, schedule, and future cost risks; evaluate current control levels to ensure correlation to water quality benefit; evaluate green infrastructure approaches that can intercept storm water infiltration, enhance community benefits, ensure regional buy-in and potentially save the rate payers money; and

WHEREAS, the EPA has shown an increased willingness to work with communities across the country on alternative methods to comply with Federal Clean Water Standards at lower costs; and

WHEREAS, funds for CH2MHill's scope of work are to be derived from the Waste Water Treatment Fund and the Peterson fund, in an amount not to exceed \$266,140.00; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Euclid.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Euclid, State of Ohio:

Section 1: That the Director of Finance is authorized to allocate and encumber \$266,140.00 for the payment of CH2M Hill, Inc. to provide scope of services that include a high level review of the city's existing CSO/SSO program, the development and evaluation of programmatic alternatives to the existing CSO/SSO program and recommendations for the how the City can apply the EPA's Integrated Planning Framework for wet weather programs and potentially modify the current Long Term Control Program.

Section 2: That funds shall be derived from the Waste Water Treatment Fund and the Peterson Fund.

Section 3: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4: That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Euclid, and provided it receives the two-thirds vote of all members of Council elected thereto, shall be in full force and effect from after it passage and approval; otherwise to be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Dear Ms. Cahill:

Pursuant to the powers granted to me under the Charter of the City of Euclid, Article IV, Section 2, I hereby notify you that I am exercising my authority to veto Ordinance **124-2014**. The legislation passed by a majority of Council authorized the appropriation of funds to engage CH2M Hill for a study of the collection and treatment system. The ordinance was not subject to competitive review with other qualified firms and is approximately three times the cost of a proposal from a competent firm already engaged by the City. Moreover, the legislation usurps the authority granted to the Director of Public Service to select engineering professionals to assist the City.

Please enter my veto and reasons on the record of the Council.

A resolution authorizing the Mayor of the City of Euclid to execute an Agreement by and between the City of Euclid and the Fraternal Order of Police, Lodge 18, as exclusive bargaining agent for full time sworn Patrol Officers and all full time sworn Supervisory Officers, exclusive of the Chief of Police and the Executive Captain, to be effective January 1, 2015 through December 31, 2017.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Chapter 4117, negotiations were held between the City of Euclid and the Fraternal Order of Police, Lodge 18, to determine equitable compensation, benefits, working hours, and other employment matters for full time sworn Patrol Officers and all full time sworn Supervisory Officers, exclusive of the Chief of Police and the Executive Captain; and

WHEREAS, the terms of the new contract include a one and a half percent (1.5%) hourly rate increase for the period of January 1, 2015, through December 31, 2015; a two percent (2%) increase effective January 1, 2016; and a one and three-quarters percent (1.75%) increase effective January 1, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the City will contribute an additional one-half percent (.5%) effective January 1, 2016 and one-half percent (.5%) effective January 1, 2017 to employee pensions bringing the total City contribution to five percent (5%) effective January 1, 2015, five and one-half percent (5.5%) effective January 1, 2016 and six percent (6%) effective January 1, 2017; and

WHEREAS, employees will have a mandatory vest policy with vests supplied by the City through grant funds and other funds on a scheduled replacement basis; and

WHEREAS, employee monthly contribution for health care costs will increase with wellness discounts, co-insurance and mandatory generic and mail order prescriptions and there will be a tobacco surcharge beginning January 1, 2016; and

WHEREAS, employees can select one current holiday as a personal day; and

WHEREAS, the contract contains a provision that requires adjustment should the IAFF agreement receive more favorable terms; and

WHEREAS, other non-economic language changes will be made to clarify current contract provisions; and

WHEREAS, the terms and conditions of the Agreement between the City of Euclid and the Fraternal Order of Police, Lodge 18, to be effective January 1, 2015 through December 31, 2017, are subject to ratification by the members of the collective bargaining unit.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Euclid, State of Ohio:
