An emergency ordinance authorizing the sale of Permanent Parcel Number 641-30-030, 880 East 209th Street, from the Euclid Land Bank, to Yvette Jones for the amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) as authorized by Ordinance Nos. 98-2010 and 101-2011.

WHEREAS, Ordinance 98-2010, passed by Council on June 21, 2010 and amended by Ordinance 101-2011 on June 20, 2011, authorizes the sale of properties in the Euclid Land Bank for private use; and

WHEREAS, at its meeting on March 10, 2015 the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval of the sale of Permanent Parcel Number 641-30-030, 880 East 209th Street, from the Euclid Land Bank, to Yvette Jones for the amount of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00); and

WHEREAS, Yvette Jones owns the adjacent property, Permanent Parcel Number 641-30-031 and desires to purchase the 641-30-030 parcel for property expansion; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Euclid Land Bank Disposition Policies, in approving the sales price the Planning and Zoning Commission concurred with the pricing policies adopted in Ordinance 101-2011, which warrant a price below the Cuyahoga County Auditor's market value; and the offer was based on a competitive counter offer after receipt of notification of a land bank sale application being submitted to the Department.

WHEREAS, the subject matter of this ordinance constitutes an emergency in that the same provides for the preservation of the public peace, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Euclid, and to allow the sale to be finalized in a timely manner.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Euclid, State of Ohio:

An emergency ordinance authorizing the sale of Permanent Parcel Number 642-23-115, 20796 Westport Avenue, from the Euclid Land Bank, to Patricia and Erik Noble and Mary Colaric, Co-Applicants, for the amount of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) as authorized by Ordinance Nos. 98-2010 and 101-2011.

WHEREAS, Ordinance 98-2010, passed by Council on June 21, 2010 and amended by Ordinance 101-2011 on June 20, 2011, authorizes the sale of properties in the Euclid Land Bank for private use; and

WHEREAS, Patricia and Erik Noble and Mary Colaric own the adjacent properties, Permanent Parcel Numbers 642-23-116 and 642-23-114 respectively, and desire to purchase the 642-23-115 parcel for property expansion; and

WHEREAS, the purchased parcel is to be split and consolidated to the respective applicants primary parcels within six (6) months of transfer into the purchasers' parcels with final approval subject to review and approval of the City Engineer; and

WHEREAS, in 1872, J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees as Morton proclaimed, "Each generation takes the earth as trustees"; and

WHEREAS, Arbor Day was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska; and

WHEREAS, Arbor Day is now observed throughout the nation and the world; and

WHEREAS, trees are crucial to our existence and contribute greatly to our enjoyment of the outdoors, bringing beauty and value to our neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, trees reduce the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, reduce heating and cooling costs, moderate the temperature, clean the air, produce oxygen and provide habitat for wildlife; and

WHEREAS, trees in our City increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, and beautify our community; and

WHEREAS, the City of Euclid by its Council and Administration wish to express their appreciation of the various trees planted throughout our community and encourage the citizens of Euclid to plant, maintain and care for trees now and in the future, so that our children and our children's children will have the opportunity to know and appreciate the significance of trees.

A resolution approving and accepting the Shore Cultural Centre Five Year Strategic Plan, dated February 2015, as prepared by the Coral Management Company, to guide future decisions related to the management, operation, governance, leasing, programming, maintenance and capital improvements to the Shore Cultural Centre during the five year plan period.

WHEREAS, through Ordinance No. 98-2009, the City of Euclid retained the Coral Management Company to lease the Shore Cultural Centre from the City, to manage the property and to develop the five-year strategic plan and associated five-year capital plan for the Shore Cultural Centre; and

WHEREAS, the Coral Management Company completed the strategic plan and after review by the project steering committee presented the plan, incorporating an operating strategy and a phased capital improvements strategy, to Euclid City Council for its consideration at the September 14th, 2009 Executive and Finance Committee; and

WHEREAS, the Coral Management Company concluded through the strategic planning process and the related public input that there is community consensus about the desire to have arts and culture as a healthy part of the Euclid community, and further, after evaluating many alternatives, recommended such activities should be operated out of the existing Shore Cultural Centre building; and

WHEREAS, at the March 11, 2015 Community/Assets/Programs Committee, the Coral Management Company presented an update on the management of the building and City Council discussed the need to officially approve and accept the five-year strategic plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Euclid, State of Ohio:

Section 1: That Euclid City Council approves and accepts the Shore Cultural Centre Five Year Strategic Plan, dated February 2015, as prepared by the Coral Management Company, to guide future decisions related to the management, operation, governance, leasing, programming, maintenance and capital improvements to the Shore Cultural Centre during the five-year plan period.

Section 2: That City Council recognize that a strategic plan is a working document and as such will conduct an annual review of the Five Year Plan to assess the need to revise or amend the plan recommendations for the remaining plan period based on performance, changing conditions, funding and other relevant considerations.

Section 3: That City Council recognize that any Plan recommendations and strategies, including capital improvements, that require a commitment and expenditure of funds will be subject to separate action by Council in accordance with the governing rules and regulations in the Codified Ordinances of the City of Euclid. Further, the City Administration and City Council recognize that successful implementation of the Five Year Strategic Plan is dependent upon funding from outside sources and encourage the Board and Management to aggressively pursue such funding for operations and capital improvements.

An emergency ordinance authorizing the Director of Law of the City of Euclid to inform the Euclid City School District that the City of Euclid is terminating the shared income tax agreement dated July 18, 1994 and any revisions thereof effective December 31, 2015.

WHEREAS, the agreement to share .85% of the city income tax was signed by the administration and the schools on July 18, 1994.

WHEREAS, the voters in the City of Euclid approved the said .85% increase in the income tax on November 8, 1994 with the schools receiving .47% and the city receiving .38%

WHEREAS, the shared agreement has no ending date.

WHEREAS, the financial needs of the city and residents are such that it is necessary to re-direct the monies back to the City.

WHEREAS, it is the intention of Euclid City Council to place on the November, 2015 ballot an issue to repeal the shared income tax.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Euclid, State of Ohio:

Section 1: That the Director of Law be and he is hereby authorized to execute a communication, in writing, immediately to the Euclid City School District that the City of Euclid is terminating the shared income tax agreement dated July 18, 1994 and any revisions thereof effective December 31, 2015.

Section 2: That is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

A resolution authorizing a cooperative agreement between the City of Euclid and the Ohio Water Development Authority to provide a loan for the purchase of real property necessary for the construction of improvements for the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

WHEREAS, the City of Euclid, the Local Government Authority and hereinafter referred to as the "LGA", has determined that the purchase of certain real property is necessary for the timely and cost efficient construction of improvements at the Wastewater Treatment Facility by Ordinance 116-2014; and

WHEREAS, the LGA desires to obtain a loan from the Ohio Water Development Authority, hereinafter the "OWDA", to finance the costs of the purchase on the terms set forth in the Cooperative Agreement, as defined below; and

WHEREAS, the loan period would not exceed 10 years and would reimburse an internal loan for the actual purchase price and costs; and

WHEREAS, the OWDA has indicated a willingness to make a loan for that purpose and on those terms.

NOW, therefore, be it resolved by the Council of the City of Euclid, State of Ohio

Section 1. That the LGA hereby approves the Cooperation Agreement with the OWDA under the provisions, terms and conditions as set forth in Exhibit A and hereby authorizes the Mayor and Acting Director of Finance for the City of Euclid to execute the Cooperative Agreement with the OWDA substantially in the form set forth in Exhibit A.

Section 2. That the Mayor is hereby authorized to prepare and file a loan application with the Ohio Water Development Authority for the purpose of funding approximately \$495,000.00 in obligations, said funding necessary to finance the reimbursement of an internal loan the cost of land acquisition for wastewater facilities projects located in the City of Euclid.

Section 3. That, if approved, the Mayor and Acting Finance Director are hereby authorized to execute any and all documentation that may be required by the OWDA to secure and administer a Cooperative Agreement for a loan for the purpose stated therein.

Section 4. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this resolution were passed in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action,, were in meetings open to the public and in compliance with all requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

An emergency ordinance authorizing the Mayor of the City of Euclid to execute all documents necessary to grant easements to Ohio Bell Telephone Company, dba AT&T Ohio, for the purpose of relocating ground equipment and lines within the area designated for the Wastewater Treatment Plant upgrades as a necessary part of the construction process.

WHEREAS, the City of Euclid is commencing with excavation of the headworks site at the Wastewater Treatment Plant and the construction will require the relocation of public utilities; and

WHEREAS, an exclusive easement, labelled as Easement A, and a non-exclusive easement, labelled as Easement B, to Ohio Bell Telephone Company, dab AT&T Ohio, as described and depicted in the attachments, will allow for the relocation of existing equipment and lines; and

WHEREAS, the enactment of the legislation is deemed to be an emergency in that the relocation of the equipment and lines is necessary to allow for the timely commencement of excavation for the headworks project.

Now, therefore, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Euclid that:

Section 1: That the Mayor of the City of Euclid is hereby authorized to execute all documents necessary to grant easements to Ohio Bell Telephone Company, dba AT&T Ohio, for the purpose of relocating ground equipment and lines within the area designated for the Wastewater Treatment Plant upgrades as a necessary part of the construction process.
