An emergency ordinance authorizing the sale of Permanent Parcel Numbers 641-22-028 and 641-22-029, 20970 and 21000 Arbor Avenue, from the Euclid Land Bank, to applicant Charlie Roscoe, First Choice Development and Demolition LLC, for the amount of One Dollar (\$1.00) each as authorized by Ordinance Nos. 98-2010 and 101-2011.

WHEREAS, Ordinance 98-2010, passed by Council on June 21, 2010 and amended by Ordinance 101-2011 on June 20, 2011, authorizes the sale of properties in the Euclid Land Bank for private use; and

WHEREAS, First Choice Development and Demolition LLC desires to purchase the 641-22-028 and 641-22-029 parcels for new construction of an approximate 1,456 square foot single family dwelling; and

WHEREAS, at its meeting on April 9, 2019 the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval of the sale of Permanent Parcel Numbers 641-22-028 and 641-22-029, 20970 and 21000 Arbor Avenue, from the Euclid Land Bank, to applicant Charlie Roscoe, First Choice Development and Demolition LLC , for the amount of One Dollar (\$1.00) each; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Euclid Land Bank Disposition Policies, in approving the sales price the Planning and Zoning Commission concurred with the pricing policies adopted in Ordinance 101-2011, which warrant a price below the Cuyahoga County Auditor's market value; on condition that the purchaser commits to construct a new house within one (1) year of the transfer of the property.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Euclid, State of Ohio:

Section 1: That the sale of Permanent Parcel Numbers 641-22-028 and 641-22-029, 20970 and 21000 Arbor Avenue, from the Euclid Land Bank, to applicant Charlie Roscoe, First Choice Development and Demolition LLC, for the amount of One Dollar (\$1.00) each as authorized by Ordinance No. 98-2010 and amended by Ordinance 101-2011 is hereby approved.

Section 2: That City Council approves the sales price adjustment below the Cuyahoga County Auditor's market value due to the condition that the purchaser commits to construct a new house within one (1) year of the transfer of the property and based on pricing policies adopted in Ordinance 98-2010 and amended by Ordinance 101-2011.

WHEREAS, the services provided by the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District, to the City of Euclid are beneficial and necessary and cannot be currently provided by the City; and,

WHEREAS, Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District will provide storm water pollution prevention monitoring on construction sites covering one acre or more; perform storm water plan reviews (SWP3) for development projects; construction plan review, as requested; perform field reviews of construction sites and water quality facilities; provide written technical advisory reports for plan submissions and field inspections; and

WHEREAS, the 2018 Memorandum of Understanding has a renewal provision for any 12-month period following the initial term and there are no changes for 2019; and

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Euclid, State of Ohio:

Section 1: That the Mayor be, and she is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to renew the current Memorandum of Understanding with the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District to provide technical assistance in implementing soil and water conservation measures for the City of Euclid and other such advisory services as needed and agreed for the year 2019. The memorandum of understanding shall be approved by the Director of Law and be on file with the Clerk of Council.

Section 2: That based upon the anticipated level of work involved, the fee for services shall not exceed \$13,390.00.

WHEREAS, the staircase runs over the top of a sewer and has deteriorated past the point of being safe; and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has done an evaluation of the staircase and the manholes which make up portions of this staircase and it has been determined the staircase and the manholes within the staircase need replaced; and

WHEREAS, GPD Group will complete a plan set which will be used for bidding this project.

WHEREAS, this project will include reconstruction of the over/under sewers, waterline replacement and pavement reconstruction on Monterey Avenue from East 200<sup>th</sup> Street to East 185<sup>th</sup> Street; and

WHEREAS, Monterey Avenue is in need of a complete reconstruction due to deterioration past the point of repairs; and

WHEREAS, this project has been awarded funding from the Ohio Public Works Commission.

The contract shall be executed by the Director of Public Service. The Board of Control is hereby authorized to waive any minor or technical irregularities that may occur during the bid process.

Section 2: Funds to pay for this expenditure are to be derived from the Waterline Replacement Fund, Ohio Public Works Commission, and Cleveland Water Department reimbursement.

A resolution authorizing the Administration to solicit a Request For Proposals from qualified and experienced firms to obtain proposals for the redevelopment of the Shore Cultural Centre.

WHEREAS, the Shore Cultural Centre Profitability Improvement Committee ("SCCPIC") was authorized by Euclid City Council in Ord. No. 136-18 for the purpose of reviewing possibilities to decrease the city's annual costs to operate Shore; and

WHEREAS, the results of the SCCPIC was presented to Euclid City Council Executive and Finance Committee on April 17, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the SCCPIC met eight times and engaged in a process to evaluate the financial operations at the Shore Cultural Centre; identify potential modifications to increase its profitability considering costs and benefits; and, evaluate and prioritize potential modifications; and

WHEREAS, one idea to improve profitability as determined by the SCCPIC was to solicit a Request for Proposals that is broad in scope so proposals may be received for the repurposing, redevelopment, and/or the revitalization of the building and site; and

WHEREAS, any proposals received will be brought back to Council for review and approval.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Council of the City of Euclid, Ohio:

Section 1: That the Administration is authorized to solicit a Request For Proposals from qualified and experienced firms to obtain proposals for the repurposing, redevelopment, and/or the revitalization of the Shore Cultural Centre. The Request will be broad allowing for varied and creative responses. The Request will also identify priorities to be utilized in the evaluation of the proposals.

Section 2: Funds to be derived from the C. M. P. Properties Urban Redevelopment Tax Increment Equivalent Fund in an amount not to exceed \$25,000.

Section 3: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all such deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

WHEREAS, the city's current phone system through Nortel has reached the end of its useful life and the city is experiencing issues with the 15 year old system; and

WHEREAS, our former telephone provider/servicer, Ronco, is no longer doing business in the Cleveland area and has recommended Laketec to handle the upgrade and maintenance/service of the new phone system going forward; and

WHEREAS, the city will be upgrading to an Avaya IP Office Server Edition on premise phone system; and

WHEREAS, Laketec is honoring the quote previously provided by Ronco from September 2018, and the pricing is below government pricing (GSA).

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Euclid, State of Ohio:

Section 1: That the Director of Finance is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to enter into a contract with Laketec, 27881 Lorain Road, North Olmsted, OH 44070, to provide an upgrade to the city's telephone system which includes a five year service/maintenance contract.

Section 2: Funds to pay for this expenditure are to be derived from funds 310 and 510 at a cost not to exceed \$148,000.

An ordinance authorizing the Director of Planning and Development of the City of Euclid to enter into contracts for asbestos assessment, abatement and demolition for various properties due to them being vacant, abandoned, uninhabitable, nuisances, unsightly and/or health and safety risks to the neighbors and surrounding community.

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 162-2015 requires Departments of Planning and Development and Building and Housing to submit proposed residential and commercial demolitions to Council for approval prior to entering into contracts for asbestos and demolition services; and

WHEREAS, upon review and inspection of the housing stock and commercial properties in the City of Euclid, there were a number of properties that were deemed to be suitable candidates for demolition based on their condition and vacant status; and

WHEREAS, the Housing Department of City of Euclid issued Violation Notices and Condemnation Orders on these various properties and are in the process of issuing certified mail notifications to all interested lienholders pursuant to title searches performed; and

WHEREAS, to date, none of the Violation Notices and Condemnation Orders have been appealed; and

WHEREAS, the properties listed are currently vacant, abandoned, uninhabitable, nuisances, unsightly and/or health and safety risks to the neighbors and surrounding community and demolition is necessary to abate the nuisance posed by the properties; and

WHEREAS, the National Vacant Property Campaign has stated in its Vacant Property: The True Costs to Communities piece that vacant property "strain[s] resources of local police, fire, building, and health departments, depreciate property values, reduce property tax revenue, attract crime, and degrade the quality of life of remaining residents".

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Euclid, State of Ohio:

Section 1: That the Director of Planning and Development is hereby authorized to enter into contracts for asbestos assessment, abatement and demolition of the following parcels:

RESOLUTION OF CONGRATULATIONS

A resolution of recognition for **Joelle Godina**, 2019 Euclid American Legion Auxiliary Unit #343 "**Miss Poppy**".

WHEREAS, The **Poppy**, a memorial flower, is a tradition which began in the years following the 1<sup>st</sup> World War when veterans returning to their homes remembered the wild poppies which lined the devastated battlefields of France and Flanders Field. Today that symbolic flower continues to pay tribute to those who have answered the call to arms and made the ultimate sacrifice; and

WHEREAS, The **Poppy** is a source of hope and aid for many in our nation, as disabled veterans receive financial assistance for making poppies by hand as part of their therapy. The **Poppy Day** program is designed exclusively for assistance to veterans and their families; and
