An emergency ordinance authorizing the Mayor of the City of Euclid or her designee to advertise for bids for construction of Phase II – East of the Euclid Waterfront Improvement Plan.

WHEREAS, Phase II – East of the Euclid Waterfront Improvement Plan continues the transformative, precedent setting work of Phase II – West currently under construction. The project promotes economic development and private investment, restores natural habitat, provides public access along a stabilized shoreline with nearly 3,000 feet of lakefront multi-modal trail, cleans stormwater prior to entering the lake, and removes approximately 40,000 tons of debris and rubble littering the nearshore area; and

WHEREAS, in December of 2009 Euclid City Council adopted the Euclid Waterfront Improvements Plan as an official addendum to the City's Master Plan establishing a \$30M vision for the City of Euclid's Lake Erie Shoreline; and

WHEREAS, in December of 2019 Euclid City Council approved contract Phase IV (D) for SmithGroup including finalizing construction documents for bid. The City of Euclid, with support from consultant SmithGroup, will manage the bidding process including preparing documents, advertising and a pre-bid meeting; and

WHEREAS, the City of Euclid anticipates advertising for bids for Phase II of the Euclid Waterfront Improvement Plan in May 2020, opening bids in June 2020 at Board of Control and awarding a construction contract, pending Council's approval, in July 2020. Construction is anticipated to last from 12 to 18 months with shoreline stabilization a priority in 2020; and

WHEREAS, bidding documents will be organized into one bid package with a single prime contract with the option for the City of Euclid to select additional alternates as funding becomes available during the time of construction; and

WHEREAS, funds to pay for this expenditure are to be derived from multiple local, state and federal funds specifically awarded for construction of Phase II of the Euclid Waterfront Improvement Plan including funds from FEMA, ODNR and the HarborTown TIF; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for this ordinance to be an emergency and take immediate effect in order to adhere to the schedule set by SmithGroup and in accordance with the grantors' timeline. A delay would push the project into a less than optimal bidding climate and potentially delay the project start date to 2021, therefore jeopardizing the contractor's ability to stabilize the shoreline in 2020; and

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Council of the City of Euclid, State of Ohio:

Section 1: That this Council does authorize the Mayor of the City of Euclid or her designee to advertise for bids for construction of Phase II – East of the Euclid Waterfront Improvement Plan.

Section 2: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were, in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3: That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Euclid, and provided it receives the two-thirds vote of all members of Council elected thereto, shall be in full force and effect from after its passage and approval; otherwise to be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

A resolution authorizing the Mayor of the City of Euclid to execute a Memorandum of Understanding on behalf of the City as a member of the Euclid Creek Watershed Council with the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District beginning January 1, 2021 – December 31, 2024 at a cost not to exceed \$3,000.00 annually.

WHEREAS, the City of Euclid is a member of the Euclid Creek Watershed Council which is made up of nine municipalities in the Euclid Creek Watershed, and this Memorandum of Understanding will continue the Euclid Creek Watershed Program that began in 2003 and the Cuyahoga County Soil and Water Conservation District will continue the implementation of the 2006 State of Ohio fully endorsed Watershed Action Plan for the Euclid Creek; and

WHEREAS, the assistance and support of the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District is necessary to provide personnel to be a Watershed Coordinator for the Council and provide staff support to the Council, coordinate the Council meetings and subcommittees, provide support to local communities for watershed improvement projects and to implement their watershed goals, encourage broad involvement in the watershed implementation process, assist with required reports to the Ohio EPA, etc.; and

WHEREAS, there is a need for funding from the member communities for the Euclid Creek Watershed Council's activities, and for the support received from the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District, which is no longer being supported by grant monies and will require each of the nine communities to fund \$3,000.00 per year for the next four years from January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2024.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Euclid, State of Ohio:

Section 1: That this Council hereby authorizes the Mayor to execute, on behalf of the City as a member of the Euclid Creek Watershed Council, a Memorandum of Understanding between the Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District and the Euclid Creek Watershed Council in a form as attached hereto as Exhibit A, which is fully incorporated herein by reference from January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2024 at an annual cost of \$3,000.00..

Section 2: That the Director of Finance is hereby authorized and directed to appropriate the funds required by the Memorandum of Understanding authorized in Section 1 of this resolution in the amount of \$3,000.00 per year and to be derived from the Water Reclamation Operating Fund.

Section 3: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

An ordinance authorizing the Director of Planning and Development to advertise for bids and enter into a contract for labor and materials necessary to construct an electronic message board at the intersection of Euclid Avenue and Chardon Road at a cost not to exceed \$98,527.00.

WHEREAS, the existing community message board located at the Southwest corner of Euclid Avenue and Chardon Road is deteriorated and outdated; and

WHEREAS, the adopted Euclid Avenue Greenway Plan recommended the replacement of the existing community message board on Euclid Avenue with a modern electronic community message board to enhance the Euclid Avenue corridor and increase communication with area residents; and

WHEREAS, the property owner, The Cleveland Metroparks, authorized the replacement of the existing community message board with a new electronic message board and related site improvements through the execution of a Licensing Agreement on February 27, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the improvements include the removal of the existing community message board and the installation of a new electronic message board and landscaping; and

WHEREAS, the electronic message board will be operated remotely with the same technology as the electronic message board on Lakeshore Boulevard in Downtown Euclid; and

WHEREAS, funding for the electronic message board on Euclid Avenue shall be derived from the municipal beautification funds of the Community Development Block Grant Fund; and

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Council of the City of Euclid, Ohio:

Section 1: That the Director of Planning and Development is hereby authorized and empowered to advertise for bids and enter into a contract for labor and materials necessary to construct a new electronic message board at the intersection of Euclid Avenue and Chardon Road at a cost not to exceed \$98,527. Said contract shall be entered into after advertising for not less than two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Euclid and awarded by the Board of Control to the lowest and best bidder. The contract shall be in form approved by the Director of Law and shall be in conformance with such plans and specifications as on file in the Department of Planning and Development. The Board of Control is hereby authorized to waive any minor or technical irregularities that may occur during the bid process.

Section 2: Funds to pay for this expenditure are to be derived from the municipal beautification funds of the Community Development Block Grant Fund.

Section 3: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were, in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

A resolution approving the substantial amendment to the Annual Action Plan for the fiscal year 2019 Entitlement Year under the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development to accept and expend funding to help alleviate negative effects of COVID-19 as authorized by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act.

WHEREAS, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act was passed by Congress on March 27<sup>th</sup>, 2020 and provides up to \$5 billion in supplemental CDBG funding; and

WHEREAS, the City of Euclid was awarded an allocation of Six Hundred Seventeen Thousand Five Hundred Sixty Nine and 00/100 Dollars (\$617,569.00) of supplemental CDBG funding to be added to the fiscal year 2019 funding to alleviate negative effects of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the Citizens' Advisory Committee of the City of Euclid recommended the supplemental CDBG funding be used to provide emergency assistance to homeowners and renters, improve food security, provide relief to small businesses and enhance community health response capabilities; and

WHEREAS, the budget for the supplemental CDBG funding reflects a sincere and dedicated effort on the part of the City of Euclid to wisely use available federal funds.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Council of the City of Euclid, State of Ohio:

Section 1: That this Council does hereby approve the substantial amendment to the Annual Action Plan for the fiscal year 2019 Entitlement Year under the Community Development Block Grant Program of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development and authorizes the Mayor to submit said amendment to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development.

A resolution approving the fiscal year 2020 Entitlement Year Annual Action Plan under the Community Development Block Grant Program of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development as recommended by the Citizens' Advisory Committee of the City of Euclid and authorizing the Mayor to submit said Annual Action Plan to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development.

WHEREAS, the City of Euclid will receive an allocation of One Million Forty Nine Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty Seven and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,049,787.00) from the Community Development Block Grant Program of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development in fiscal year 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Citizens' Advisory Committee of the City of Euclid, appointed by the Mayor to determine the needs of the community that can be addressed through the Community Development Block Grant Program, has designated programs which relate to those needs and allocated funds to accomplish these programs; and

WHEREAS, the recommendations of the Citizens' Advisory Committee represent a sincere effort to meet the primary objectives of the Grant; namely, the provision of decent housing, a suitable living environment and expanded economic opportunities, principally for persons of low-and-moderate income; and

WHEREAS, the recommendations of the Citizens' Advisory Committee provide improved planning which coordinates housing assistance and Community Development programs and encourages a comprehensive approach to dealing with urban problems; and

WHEREAS, the Action Plan for the fiscal year 2020 Entitlement Year is consistent with the goals and objectives of the five-year Consolidated Plan developed by the City; and

WHEREAS, the Action Plan for the fiscal year 2020 Entitlement Year reflects an effort on the part of the City of Euclid to wisely use available federal funds.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Council of the City of Euclid, State of Ohio:

An ordinance repealing Section 545.19 Panhandling, of Chapter 545 Peace Disturbances, of the General Offenses Code of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Euclid, due to potential constitutional violations and lack of necessity.

WHEREAS, the City of Euclid seeks to update its ordinances to ensure they are in accordance with the U.S. and Ohio Constitutions, recent federal and state court decisions regarding freedom of speech, and various cultural and social changes since 2006; and

WHEREAS, every panhandling ordinance challenged in federal court has been found unconstitutional following the U.S. Supreme Court's decision in *Reed v. Gilbert* in 2015, which heightened protections for freedom of speech; and

WHEREAS, civil rights organizations, such as the American Civil Liberties Union and the National Law Center on Homelessness and Poverty, have recently put pressure on municipalities across the country to repeal panhandling ordinances, citing federal and state court decisions finding that such ordinances are a violation of the First Amendment speech activity; and

WHEREAS, in light of recent decisions by federal and state courts, the City of Euclid is subject to constitutional challenges and/or civil liability while its current legislation prohibiting panhandling remains in effect; and

WHEREAS, ACLU sent letters to 69 cities in Ohio asking them to not enforce and repeal their panhandling ordinances, and to date, Council is aware that the following larger cities in Ohio have repealed their panhandling ordinances: Cleveland, Akron, Canton, Columbus, Dayton, Youngstown and Toledo; and

WHEREAS, the Euclid Police Department has only issued four (4) citations for panhandling in the last five years, therefore the current code prohibiting panhandling is nearly obsolete and unnecessary and repeal of the ordinance is warranted.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Euclid, State of Ohio:

Section 1: That Section 545.19 "Panhandling" of Chapter 545 "Peace Disturbances" of the General Offenses Code of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Euclid is hereby repealed:

**545.19 PANHANDLING**

- ~~(a) No person shall knowingly do any of the following:~~
  - ~~(1) Solicit in an aggressive manner in any public place:~~
    - ~~A. Touching the solicited person without the solicited person's consent;~~
    - ~~B. Blocking or interfering with the safe or free passage of a pedestrian or vehicle by any means including unreasonably causing a pedestrian or vehicle operator to take evasive action to avoid physical contact;~~
    - ~~C. Following behind, ahead or alongside a person who walks away from the panhandler after being solicited;~~
    - ~~D. Using profane or abusive language, either during the solicitation or following a refusal to make a donation, or making any statement, gesture, or other communication which would cause a reasonable person to be fearful or feel compelled; or~~
    - ~~E. Panhandling a person while such person is standing in line and waiting to be admitted to a commercial establishment.~~
  - ~~(2) Solicit within 20 feet of any entrance or exit of any financial institution or check-cashing business or within 20 feet of any automated teller machine without the consent of the owner of the property or another person legally in possession of such facilities. Provided, however, that when an automated teller is located within the automated teller machine facility, such distance shall be measured from the entrance or exit of the facility.~~
  - ~~(3) Solicit an operator or other occupant of a motor vehicle while such vehicle is located on any street.~~
  - ~~(4) Solicit by stating that funds are needed to meet a specific need, when the solicitor has the funds to meet that need, does not intend to use funds to meet that need, or does not have that need.~~
  - ~~(5) Solicit in any public transportation vehicle; or at any bus, or train station or stop in any public parking lot or structure.~~
  - ~~(6) Solicit in a group of two or more persons.~~

~~(7) Solicit within 6 feet of an entrance to a building.~~

~~(b) As used in this section:~~

~~(1) "Automated Teller Machine" shall mean a device, linked to a financial institution's account records, which is able to carry out transactions, including, but not limited to: account transfers, deposits, cash withdrawals, balance inquiries, and mortgage and loan payments.~~

~~(2) "Automated Teller Machine Facility" shall mean the area comprised of one or more automatic teller machines, and any adjacent space which is made available to banking customers after regular banking hours.~~

~~(3) "Financial Institution" means any banking corporation, credit union, or foreign exchange office.~~

~~(4) "Panhandling" means any solicitation made in person upon any street, public place or park in the City, in which a person requests an immediate donation of money or other gratuity from another person, and includes but is not limited to seeking donations:~~

~~A. By vocal appeal or for music, singing, or other street performance; and~~

~~B. Where the person being solicited receives an item of little or no monetary value in exchange for a donation, under circumstances where a reasonable person would understand that the transaction is in substance a donation;~~

~~C. However, panhandling shall not include the act of passively standing or sitting nor performing music, signing or other street performance with a sign or other indication that a donation is being sought, without any vocal request other than in response to an inquiry by another person.~~

~~(5) "Public Place" means a place where a government entity has title, to which the public or substantial group of persons has access, including but not limited to any street, highway, parking lot, plaza, transportation facility, school, place of amusement, park, or playground.~~

~~(c) Whoever violates this section is guilty of Panhandling, a misdemeanor of the fourth degree. The penalty shall be as provided in Section 599.02.~~

Section 2: That Section 545.19 "Panhandling" of Chapter 545 "Peace Disturbances" of the General Offenses Code of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Euclid is hereby repealed.

Section 3: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of the Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4: That is ordinance shall be in full force and effect from after the earliest period allowed by law.
